

# Pipeline safety in the prairies

Enbridge operates a liquids pipeline system in the prairie provinces of Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba, we call the Prairie Region. This system includes rights-of-way (a strip of land of varying widths) that run from Edmonton, Alberta through Saskatchewan to Gretna, Manitoba as well as a corridor that runs from Hardisty, Alberta to the U.S. border in southern Alberta.

Enbridge's Prairie Region system is buried under the ground. Pipeline markers along the rights-of-way show the approximate location of the buried pipelines. ## In an emergency

Pipeline incidents are rare but they can occur. If you:

- Smell an odour like oil, diesel or gasoline
- Hear a hissing or roaring noise
- See a moist patch or pool of black, brown or yellow liquid

## This is what you should do:

- Put out cigarettes or any other lit material
- Turn off any ignition sources
- If it is safe to do so, warn others to stay away
- Leave the area quickly and move to a position upwind of the area

## Do not:

- Touch or go near any of the liquid
- Start any ignition source such as machinery or equipment
- Turn on or off anything that might create a spark (cell phones, telephones, light switches) until you are in a safe location
- Smoke or light a match or lighter
